# Monkey Pox Table Top Exercise – March 2021

#### Date of Exercise - March 2021

In March 2021, the <u>Nuclear Threat Initiative (NTI)</u> and the <u>Munich Security Conference (MSC)</u> conducted a tabletop exercise that portrayed a global pandemic of the deadly monkeypox virus. In the scenario, the monkeypox was caused by a terrorist attack. The exercise scenario portrayed a deadly, global pandemic involving an unusual strain of monkeypox virus that emerged in the fictional nation of Brinia and spread globally over 18 months.

Question: Why were they training for a Monkey Pox Pandemic, when Monkey Pox was extremely rare in 2021?

### 270 Million Fatalities over 18 months

The fictional pandemic resulted in **more than three billion cases and 270 million fatalities** worldwide by the end of the exercise. after 18 months, the monkeypox cases amounted to 3.2 billion, with 271 million deaths.

Question: Why are the number of fatalities from the Monkey Pox matching the number of illnesses produced by the Covid vaccines (1 in 20 illnesses from 5.3 billion vaccinated = 270 million)?

## Outbreak May 15<sup>th</sup> 2022 - Brinia (=Britannia)

In their tabletop scenario of the monkeypox pandemic, the outbreak will start on May 15, 2022, in Brinia.

May 15, 2022, is uncannily close to the <u>World Health Organization</u> report on the monkeypox virus in Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

- On 13 May 2022, WHO was notified of two laboratory-confirmed cases and one probable case of monkeypox, from the same household, in the United Kingdom.
- On 15 May, four additional laboratories confirmed cases had been reported amongst Sexual Health Services attendees presenting with a vesicular rash illness in men who have sex with men (MSM).

Question: Why did the actual date and location of Monkey Pox outbreak coincide with the exercise date and location of outbreak?

### Timed to Justify the Pandemic Treaty

May 22, 2022, the WHO discussed the Global Pandemic Treaty at the World Health Assembly.

Many criticized and resisted this WHO treaty because it would give the WHO absolute power over any country during a pandemic.

Question: Was the Monkey Pox outbreak timed to justify the WHO's Pandemic Treaty?
